TIMBER FRAMING + ADVANCED TIMBER FRAMING



In the summer of 2023, Yestermorrow students embarked on timber framing journey to construct our friend Eddie Merma's home. Over the span of a couple of weeks, these two classes learned the techniques and methods necessary to raise a timber frame structure.
